## REGULAR MEETING December 19, 2019

The Regular meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Upper Nyack was held at the village hall on Thursday, December 19, 2019 at 7:00 PM.

## <u>POLICE REPORTS</u> – PO Valerio presented the report.

On Dec. 12, 2019 there was a power outage as a result of tree removal equipment hitting wires at 409 N Broadway.

Nov. 26<sup>th</sup> there was a mechanical fire at 350 N Highland Ave. (Alliance Seminary) PO Valerio delivered File for Life cards for distribution to residents and explained their purpose. Residents can fill in pertinent health information and medication list in case of an emergency first responders would have the information at hand should the person be incapable of providing it.

There was a major drug arrest (2.5 million street value) in West Nyack by the CPD, Detective Bureau, Street Crime Unit, Canine Unit and NYC Police Dept. Several car break-ins and person was apprehended. Tips for shopping during holidays, park under lights, go with friends or during the day or weekdays. And most importantly do not leave valuables in the car.

4 summonses: overnight parking; speeding; 2 unregistered vehicles.

Mayor Tarapata asked how long a car would have to be left on the street to be considered abandoned. PO Valerio stated 48 hrs. The registration would be checked. If abandoned a large orange sticker with tow date is placed on the windshield.
