WHEREAS, The State of New York Unified Court System has advised the Village of Upper Nyack Justice Court that the State Legislature has authorized funding to the Justice Courts through the Justice Court Assistance Program (JCAP) and

WHEREAS, the Unified court System (USC) will directly provide support to the Justice Courts thereby allowing JCAP funding to meet the needs of the Justice Courts,

WHEREAS, the Upper Nyack Justice Court Office is currently located in the main office of the Village Hall and the Board recognizes the need for a separate, secure, and private office location for the Court Clerk and Judge;

WHEREAS, the Court Computer program has introduced new software and hardware to enable scanning of case documents;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it

RESOLVED, that the Village Board hereby authorizes submission of a grant application in an amount not to exceed \$30,000.00 for funding through the New York State Justice Court Assistance Program, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Mayor is hereby authorized to execute the grant application to the Justice Court Assistance Program, New York State Office of Court Administration.
