REGULAR MEETING June 16, 2005

The Regular meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Upper Nyack was held at the village hall on Thursday, June 16, 2005 at 7:00 PM.

The Mayor and Board of Trustees requested the Village Attorney explain to Michael & Nadine Castro, who are currently applying to the Planning Board for a two lot subdivision, what direction they may have to take with regards to the access to the roadway. They will be required to go to the Zoning Board of Appeals for a variance from the requirements of Section 7-736(2) of the New York State Village Law. Their lots will access onto Jewett Road which is a private road.

POLICE REPORT - Read and noted

Trustee Malcolm requested more of a police presence during the morning commute where drivers tend to speed down Old Mountain Rd. to Broadway. Resident Walter Lee complained about young kids drinking late at night on Larchdale Ave. PO Ross suggested to Mr. Lee to always call the front desk and report it.

JUSTICE REPORT - Read and noted.

<u>PUBLIC HEARING-</u>Local Law #2 of 2005 – Amending Article VI, Architectural Harmony-Board of Architectural Review Mayor Esmay opened the public hearing.

The Village Clerk read the public hearing notice.

Mayor Esmay asked Trustee Tarapata to give some background as to why the Board was amending this law. Trustee Tarapata noted that it was the request of the Architectural Review Board to receive applications for review sooner in the process to protect the quality of the neighborhood.

Trustee Tarapata highlighted some of the changes: 1) application would go to the ARB sooner 2) 5 year appointment to the Board for members 3) attendance requirement

As no one from the public wish to speak on this matter, Trustee Morgan made a motion to close the public hearing, seconded by Trustee Tarapata and so moved. AYES: All NOES: None

Trustee Morgan made a motion that the Board of Trustees repeal Article VI Architectural Harmony-Board of Architectural Review from the 1962 Zoning Ordinance of the Village of Upper Nyack and replace it with an amended Article VI –Architectural Harmony- Architectural Review also known as Local Law #2 of 2005, seconded by Trustee Tarapata and with no further discussion it was so moved with a call for a vote:

<u>LARCHDALE DRAINAGE</u> - Several residents of Larchdale Ave. (Jerome Muhlenberg, Walter Lee & Craig Bottrill) requested to speak to the Board about the continuing drainage issues on Larchdale.

The Board noted to the residents that some Board members would be meeting with LMS (firm that is conducting a drainage study in the village) next week and would have better details about their findings.

Walter Lee, Larchdale Ave., presented a letter from the former owner of his house from 1996 discussing the drainage problems that continue there now. The residents also complained about the snow fence that they feel is not protecting the public and deer are becoming impaled on it. They want it removed.

Mr. Bottrill requested that sandbags be removed also.

Trustee Tarapata noted that the engineer for the project known as the "Badi subdivision" has notified the village that work they were requested to do is now complete and the Village can go back and proceed with village drainage on Larchdale.

LMS will prioritize projects that need to be done.

Mr. Lee and Mr. Muhlenberg wondered if the applicant had done all the required improvements according to the approved map and the minutes. Mr. Muhlenberg believes that the Larchdale storm sewer pipe is not large enough.

<u>Update – New DPW Building</u>- Trustee Malcolm reported to the Board that The structural shop drawings will be done next Friday. The pre-engineer drawings were handed in today. The building will definitely be delivered by July 8, 2005. The under-slab and utilities will be in this week.

<u>DPW-TRUCK-SURPLUS</u> – Trustee Tarapata made a motion that the Board of Trustees agrees to declare as surplus the 1998 Chevy 3500 series truck, seconded by Trustee Morgan and so moved.

An ad will be placed in the paper for sale of the truck.

The Board of Trustees reviewed a sign request from a Clarkstown Police Officer. The Board will not place any of the signs at this time as they review all signage in the village.

Trustee Tarapata made a motion to adjourn seconded by Trustee Morgan and so moved. The meeting was adjourned at 9:50 PM.
