

## What is Community Choice Aggregation?

Through CCA municipalities can create a buying group of residents & small businesses to purchase energy.

The buying group can be used to:

- Save consumers money
- Provide 100% renewable energy for electricity

## BENEFITS OF CCA

- Saves consumer \$
- Consumer protection
- Local choice of energy source
- 100% renewable energy
- Enhances desirability of community

## COST SAVINGS IN OTHER COMMUNITIES

- Average savings / household \$50 / year
- Hastings -\$100,000 collective savings 1 year
- North Castle-\$1,202,000 collective savings
   2+ years
- Renewable energy through CCA approx. 5 to 11% cost savings

## WHO CAN PARTICIPATE?

- Residents
- Small businesses
- Houses of worship
- Municipalities
- Possibly schools

### WHERE HAS CCA BEEN IMPLEMENTED TO DATE?

8 states – 5+ million people participating

**New York** 

Westchester – 26 participating communities

**Rockland County:** 

- Wesley Hills in process
- Nyack, South Nyack, Piermont under review

# Who provides energy under CCA?

Currently: O & R is our default energy provider.

Through CCA: a new company becomes the default energy provider, delivering clean energy at lower cost than O & R.

Energy continues to be delivered by O&R.

# CCA Enhances Both Community Choice and Individual Choice.

CCA lets the community choose energy source.

 The individual homeowner can accept the new choice or choose another provider, including O&R.

### **COMMUNITY OPTIONS FOR CCA**

- 100% renewable energy is the Green Committee's recommendation for the default option.
- The community can offer renewable energy as the default, while still offering a second, 'least cost'/fossil fuels, option.
- The community will save money with either option.
- Current cost difference between 'least cost' and renewable:
   \$1.80 per month for average household.

### INDIVIDUAL CHOICE

Individuals can choose at any time:

- 1. Accept the default community choice (no action needed)
- 2. Choose to remain with O & R individual account
- 3. Opt down to fossil fuels

There is no financial penalty to choose a different option.

Current subsidies to seniors & other eligible individuals are retained.

# O&R's ROLE

Under CCA, O&R continues to:

- Deliver electricity
- Repair & maintain lines –including emergency repairs in power outages
- Bill customers

# PUBLIC RESPONSE TO CCA

## Wesley Hills:

Overwhelmingly positive community response

### Westchester:

Between 85- 99% kept the default clean energy option.

# The Village appoints a NYS approved CCA Administrator to:

- Collect data from the community
- Bundle communities to maximize cost savings.
- Negotiate best price on behalf of the community.
- Administer the contract, including responding to public questions, over the term of the contract.

# How does a community adopt CCA?

- Non-binding Board resolution expressing interest in CCA
- Public meeting to inform public & garner feedback
- Enabling law
- Select a CCA Administrator company
- Memorandum of Understanding
- 60 day public outreach period Required under NYS law
- Letter to every account holder, with opportunity to opt out
- Contract for energy with CCA Administrator

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# **CCA Implementation in Hastings-on-Hudson**

### **Summary:**

- ✓ 1<sup>st</sup> public announcement in October 2015
- ✓ Approximately \$100k saved in Hastings-on-Hudson during 1<sup>st</sup> year

## Similarities between Hastings-on-Hudson and Upper Nyack

- ✓ Population (2010 Census)
  - 7,849 in Hastings-on-Hudson
  - 2,063 in Upper Nyack
- ✓ Geographic location and demographics

## Timeline of Community Announcements

#### **October 2015:**

- ✓ 1<sup>st</sup> public announcement about CCA initiative
- ✓ Local law passed to join Sustainable Westchester's CCA

#### **March 2016:**

- ✓ ConEd Solutions wins bids for both "brown" & "green" power
- ✓ "Green energy" chosen as default.

### **September 2017:**

- √ 4 of the last 14 months brown was cheaper than current green.
- ✓ Collective savings of \$100K.
